

# SHOW AND TELL

Bill Lesko brought his new A4 Skyhawk to the meeting for Show and Tell. It is manufactured by Freewing and distributed by Motion RC. The 12 blade EDF bird has a 37 inch wingspan and is 56 inches long. Bill says the aircraft uses a 6S, 5000 mah battery pack to power it up. The 3530-1850 out-runner motor is connected to a 80 mm fan. The jet has retracts and split flaps and includes detachable fuel tanks and a Avionics hump. Reviews say it has a top flying speed of about 95 MPH. Lesko said it was very quick (about 1-2 hours) to assemble with maybe only a dozen screws used in the assembly.

Bill has yet to maiden the aircraft but says "he should be ready as soon as he gets up the nerve"

How is it done? It is a sequence of ten maneuvers that are tied together to look like a fluid aerobatic execution. You are expected to follow the list of maneuvers listed on the right.


Any fixed wing aircraft that you are comfortable flying will be allowed.

Study the list and get practicing. Its nothing more than basic flying maneuvers, just flown one after the other, regardless of wind conditions.

Maneuvers don't have to be memorized as a Caller will let you know what maneuver is done next.

Its always a fun event and the challenge make it even more fun.
