

The charge for this registration is \$5.00 for 3 years.

It has a 3150 KV motor and a 40 amp ESC installed. The wingspan is about 35 inches with a length of 39 inches. The landing gear is fixed design to allow for some rougher landings. It requires a 6 channel radio and a 4S, 2200—3300 battery.
