Improved LiPo battery discharger

I purchased a new discharger. I "needed" one because the ISDT discharger I have is difficult to see the settings of the LED lamps in daylight, and it discharged to storage voltage without monitoring the individual cells. To monitor the individual cells, I had to connect my battery tester to the balance connector. That worked, but I had to be close-by to monitor the monitor.






I found the new discharger on Amazon. It's called the KACALLAP α12 LiPo Battery Smart Discharger One Key Intelligent Balance Discharge Voltage Efficient Heat Dissipation. (Really!) Priced at \$79.99. (I think most of the cost was in printing the name ③)

The Discharger supports 2 to 6 cells and discharges at up to 120watts. The unit is housed in an aluminum case that is also part of the heat-sink. A 3.2-inch backlit LCD display shows total voltage, total discharge, discharge current, discharge time, and each cell voltage.

To operate you plug the discharge plug into the XT-

60 connector

and plug the balance connector into the connector next to the XT-60. Then press the Start/Stop button to turn on. Pressing the button a second time, there will be a single beep, and the unit starts the discharge. When the battery discharges to 3.85V per cell, the discharging stops and the unit beeps three times. If a cell drops below 3.85 volts the unit stops discharging, beeps, and flashes the cell that has dropped below 3.85V.







Press the Start/Stop button once for three seconds to shut the unit off. If left alone, the unit will turn off after two minutes.

The advantage of this discharger is that even though I am still nearby I won't have to continuously watch it so it won't over discharge a cell.
