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# NANOOK FUN FLY 2021-2022




Bill Dimsey fires up his nitro powered scratch built aircraft.


A few years later I purchased another Compensator kit but this time with a fiberglass fuselage. That one was lighter, and I included electric retracts.

LK: I guess that I would have to say my father. He took me for a ride in a J3 Cub out of North Brunswick airfield. (which is no longer there) when I was a youngster.






**BG:** What other hobbies do you have?
