# 6th Annual Pattern Fun Fly

The "Club Class Pattern Fun Fly" is now in the books for 2022. It was held on June 25th, with the weather being perfect, beautiful blue sky, with very little breeze.

There were eleven fixed -wing pilots that took to the skies one by one, with Mike D. also flying his helicopter thru the 10 maneuver sequence.

Each pilot took their turn flying their aircraft with the help of "caller" that told them the scheduled maneuvers to fly. Two club members at a time mostly John D, and Alex S. or Mike D. were judging each maneuver with the goal to fly as straight, smooth and level as possible. "It's a challenge to fly a sequence more than just flying around with no flight plan" said one of the pilots. It tests the pilots skills and helps to become a better pilot.

The ten maneuvers started out with a **take-off**, into a **straight flight out** then into a **procedure turn**, then into a **straight flight back**. Hopefully by now the competitor is finally starting to calm down a little. Yes its can be intimidating to fly in front of others. But remember it's a **Fun** Fly. The goal is to fly as smooth, and stay on track and a consistent altitude.

Once the pilot got thru the first four skills, he sets up to do a **Stall Turn.** Each of the maneuvers, at this point should be centered in front of the pilot and judges. There was an orange pole set up about 300 feet in the field to be used as a reference. When the

stall turn is completed, the pilot once again sets the plane up to perform an **Immelmann Turn**. After that he flies a **45 degree upline**, followed by a **inverted flight** on the downwind leg. The pilot then does two **inside loops** which many pilots had problems with, and then sets up for the **Landing**.

There were two rounds flown with a half time intermission consisting of hot dogs, cold refreshments, and chips. In between rounds just for fun a few guys flew their planes.

The second round of competition started after everyone had their fill of Gerry's cooking. Almost all the pilots flew



a second round, and Jeff A and Mike D helped to total the score sheets.

Scoring the highest was Bruce, with Jeff second and Mike D just a half a point behind. Everyone had a fun time and enjoyed themselves.

"I hope to do this again in the fall" said Bruce, and everyone was in agreement.

Thanks to all that participated and all the guys that helped out and made it happen. Thanks to Tony C for cutting the field, just prior to the event.




Paul did a nice job flying the Apprentice.
