John Donnelly writes. "He first met Horace in the early 70's when he came to Thompson Park to demonstrate the Dieter Schuter helicopter. It had full controls, was touchy, always needed adjustment, and no gyros. He had an articulated stand that was used as a training device. The copter was strapped on and you could attempt to "fly" it with about 2' of vertical lift, and bank angles that would not allow the rotors to touch. It was like balancing a boll bearing on the tip of a needle".

Horace came to our field for a couple of competitions but we didn't see much of him until Pulda got a runway. He and a group of Monmouth members joined the club until they put down a runway like ours.

in a little right rudder into one of the balsa airplane kits, so as you can imagine, that didn't' end well. We lived a few block from a local baseball field where we could fly our latest aircraft.
