


Save the Date: Upcoming Events

TechTalk, Glo/ Gasoline Engines.

Once the business of the March meeting came to a close, Mike D put together an informative discussion on engines, He covered many aspects of glo and gasoline engines. Although most flyers these days prefer the more reliable electric motors for their power systems many pilots still enjoy the sound and smell of the 2 or 4 stoke nitro or gasoline fed powerplants. You get a lot more flying time by using a tank of fuel, in your plane or heli vs the electric motors where you possibly only get 5 5 minutes of flight if your lucky. R/C cars and boats are mostly powered by 2 cycle glo engines, but many have gone to electric power too.

Mike brought many examples of the various types and sizes of engines and it really comes down to the pilots preference. The 2 2 stroke engines are priced lower and are a little bit more finnicky than the 4 stroke engines. The cost of glo fuel is a lot more

than a gallon of gasoline. The 4 stroke engines are better at idling than 2 stroke glo engines.

DiGennaro brought along some additional items that are needed to maintain glo and gas engines,



such as spare glo plugs, battery operated starter, glo drivers. The fuel powered planes need to be cleaned after a flight because of the engine residue blowing back onto the wings and tail surfaces. Paper towels and a good cleaner removes the mess.

Which type and brand of engine that you prefer is up to you. There are many brands and sizes out there as well as what you want to spend.






FOR SALE

The AMA is reminding us to label each of your aircraft. At a minimum your AMA and FAA registration should be visible on the outside of your aircraft.

The last few times that I saw club members planes come down from the trees, after a few months, there was no identifying information to know whose aircraft it was. It may help you to get your aircraft back in the event of a flyaway. BG
