Show and Tell for August

Brian J brought in his latest purchase, a FMS Electric Ducted Fan (EDF) model, 64mm jet, *Futura*. It comes in three different color schemes, green, red or yellow. Its designed to fly on a 4S, 2200 Mha Battery. The foam plane is \$189. plug and play design with spring type landing gear. Brian has not yet flown it but by the time you read this he should have a few good flights with it.



Show and Tell Model Brian J brought in a Model for the August meeting. Bring in your latest aircraft for the September meeting.

Model of the Month / Show & Tell Guidelines:

- If one member shows off their new creation it is considered a "Show and Tell".
- If **two or more** aircraft are shown and discussed at a meeting, then the members vote on who's is the best and then it becomes "**Model of the Month**" and a prize may be awarded.
- Bring your plane, heli, quad, or what ever you fly, to the next meeting and share it with the group.

Tech Talk Tools to Balance your aircraft.

John D. has been building and flying model planes since he was a child. Correctly balancing your aircraft will give you a successfully flying aircraft. John brought in a few tools that he demonstrated to give you some idea of what devices are available. Many of today's kits will give you the balance point, (BP) and some will just give you a range of where the balance should be. Remember a tail heavy plane is very difficult to fly, and may give you a plane that will have you talking about "Crash of the month".

One of the first balancing devices John built (and probably many of us have too) was out of a 2x6 piece of wood. It had many holes drilled into it at various locations and two pencils with chisel point erasers. This design worked great, and still works well today.

The next device John discussed comes as a kit, the one John has is made by Sig. It is available by other companies as well. Once you set it up for your plane, usually a distance from the leading edge of the wing, to the BP it will give you a indication of whether you are in balance or not. Then you can adjust your battery, or radio or add weights as needed.

Pictured below is the third tool discussed was called a Vanessa. It is a little bit more complicated and is basically a balancing design using a plumb bob, and level to see if the aircraft is level or what needs to be added, subtracted or moved to bring the plane into the correct configuration. It works best with larger models and is a little more complicated but works well.



The most electronically advanced system Donnelly demonstrated uses a set of three small electronic scales and is a wireless system. It's manufactured by SkyRC. Each wheel is placed one of the scales and the plane must be set to the datum level line. The program will calculate the weight of the plane, tell you how much, if any weight is needed to correct and the locations of

where to place the weight. This device is also used by R/C car enthusiasts also to get their best cornering speeds.

John went on to answer questions from the audience and wrapped up his teach talk.

Good info and product demonstrations.

All of the Tech Talks this year have been full of great information for beginners and seasoned pilots alike. However it is hard to put this information to paper and pen, its always best to be at the meeting and I guarantee you will get more out of it.
